The fees listed are representative of charges you may expect to encounter. All new patients will be charged an office visit fee; established patients MAY be charged an office visit fee. A few examples:

1. New patient: mild acne requiring only topical treatment (\$95) + "freezing" of warts with liquid nitrogen (\$125) = total charge of \$220.00
2. New patient: history of skin cancer, whole body skin exam (\$130) + biopsy of suspicious lesion (\$130) = \$260.
3. Established patient: mild psoriasis, adjustment of treatment = \$65.
4. Established patient: history of skin cancer, whole body skin exam (\$80) + biopsy of two recently changing moles (\$130 + \$75) = \$285.
5. Established patient: curet (surgical) removal of plantar wart = \$125.
6. Established patient: adjustment of acne treatment (\$65) + removal of skin tags (\$125) = \$190.
